The Beauty of Love

PARTICIPANT NOTES

Welcome to part 4 of our 5 week series, "The Story that Makes Sense of Everything." In this series we are exploring the metanarrative (overarching story) of the Bible. As we understand God's story we are better able to make sense of our own story and how we fit with His amazing plan. The title of this week's session is "The Beauty of Love". What is God like? Why should I trust Him? Why should I want Jesus to be my king? A key place to answer these questions is the cross. At the cross we learn that God is sacrificial, selfless love. As we consider what Jesus has done for us on the cross, we can be awed by the beauty of God's love and drawn to fully receive that love. God's desire for us as His image bearers is to reflect the same love we see modelled for us on the cross, a sacrificial, reconciling, enemy love.

Q - What is your favorite story about Jesus or teaching from Jesus that stirs up your love for Him?

Here are some examples:

Jesus' Miracles:

Jesus turns water into wine (John 2:1-11)

Jesus heals people (John 4:46-54, 5:1-18)

Jesus feeds the 5,000 (John 6:5-14)

Jesus raises Lazarus from the dead (John 11:1-45)

Jesus' Teachings on Love:

"Love the Lord your God ... love your neighbour as yourself." Matthew 22:37-39

"A new command I give you, love one another; Just as I have loved you ..." John 13:34

Jesus washing the disciples' feet (John 13:1-15)

Jesus promises He is going to prepare a place for us and will return for us. (John 14:1-4)

Jesus blesses the children (Mark 10:13-16)

Jesus speaks to the woman at the well (John 4:4-42)

Some have said that our relationship with Jesus has four dimensions: Jesus is our teacher, Saviour, Lord and friend. While we hopefully see Jesus as all four, we often have one that is our dominant lens.

Q - Which one do you tend to see Jesus as the most?

“This is how we know what love is: Jesus Christ laid down his life for us. And we ought to lay down our lives for our brothers and sisters. If anyone has material possessions and sees a brother or sister in need but has no pity on them, how can the love of God be in that person? Dear children, let us not love with words or speech but with actions and in truth.” 1 John 3:16-18

Q - Where do you feel moved to participate in reflecting this kind of sacrificial love into the world?

“This is love: not that we loved God, but that he loved us and sent his Son as an atoning sacrifice for our sins.” 1 John 4:10

Q – How does this truth stir you to love God?
