LifeGroup Study UNSTUCK: What Comes First 2022-01-09 Leader Notes

OVERVIEW:

Welcome to our LifeGroup study, Unstuck. This series is all about experiencing change in our lives. In today's study, we'll dig into what comes first. True change happens when we live in the truth of our identity in Christ and allow Him to transform our lives.

ICEBREAKER: My One Word.

As we begin a brand new year, what one word would you choose to describe how you feel about the prospect of 2022? You may be feeling hope, or apprehension, excitement or fear. Share your word with the group and why you chose it.

STUDY:

READ: Romans 7:14-20

¹⁴ We know that the law is spiritual; but I am unspiritual, sold as a slave to sin. ¹⁵ I do not understand what I do. For what I want to do I do not do, but what I hate I do. ¹⁶ And if I do what I do not want to do, I agree that the law is good. ¹⁷ As it is, it is no longer I myself who do it, but it is sin living in me. ¹⁸ For I know that good itself does not dwell in me, that is, in my sinful nature.¹⁹ For I have the desire to do what is good, but I cannot carry it out. ¹⁹ For I do not do the good I want to do, but the evil I do not want to do—this I keep on doing. ²⁰ Now if I do what I do not want to do, it is no longer I who do it, but it is sin living in me that does it.

- All of us find ourselves doing the things we don't want to do and not doing the things we want to do. God wants us to be "Unstuck" – to experience the freedom He has for us – freedom from the grip of sin and bad habits – freedom to love and follow Jesus. In what areas of your life are you feeling "stuck" these days? How do you relate to what Paul writes in Romans 7:14-20?
- 2. On Sunday, Pete said, "The most effective way to change your habits is to focus not on what you want to achieve, but on who you wish to become." What did he mean by this?

<u>LEADER NOTE:</u> "Becoming" is key to change. For the follower of Jesus, our identity in Him sets the purpose and direction for who we are becoming.

3. On Sunday, Pete gave us a quote we can say to affirm the truth of who we are in Christ: "I am one in whom Christ dwells and delights and I live in His unshakeable Kingdom." Read this statement out loud together as a group. Do it again!

- How does this statement speak to who you are becoming?

<u>LEADER NOTE:</u> Having your group members read this statement out loud can help them in the process of living in the truth of who they are in Christ. You could encourage your group members to keep circling back to this truth by writing down these words on a card and putting them where they can see and read them each day this week.

4. READ: 2 Corinthians 5:17

"Therefore, if anyone is in Christ, the new creation has come: The old has gone, the new is here!"

- What do you think it means to be a "new creation" in Christ?

<u>LEADER NOTE:</u> The word translated "new" in this verse is the word *kainos* which means "something just made that is unlike anything else in existence". Our identity in Christ means that we are an entirely new creation. He didn't just clean up the old you and make a few tweaks. He has made you entirely new! <u>SOURCE: Got Questions – Who I Am in Christ</u>

5. Here are some truths about who we are in Christ. Take turns looking up the following passages. What highlights do you find there about our identity in Christ?

READ: 2 Peter 1:4

<u>LEADER NOTE:</u> In Christ, we are "partakers in the divine nature". God Himself, in the person of the Holy Spirit, has taken up residence in our heart. We are in Christ and He is in us.

READ: Romans 6:4-6

<u>LEADER NOTE:</u> Just as God raised Jesus from the dead, we have been raised by God to walk in the new life He has for us. We are united with Him and no longer slaves to sin.

READ: Romans 8:1-4

LEADER NOTE: We are no longer condemned, but we are set free to follow Jesus and live for Him.

READ: Romans 8:37

<u>LEADER NOTE:</u> We are more than conquerors through Him who loved us.

READ: Ephesians 1:3-8

<u>LEADER NOTE:</u> We have been given every spiritual blessing in Christ. We've been chosen by Him. We've been made holy. We are predestined to be His children. We've been redeemed, forgiven and loved immeasurably in Him.

6. On Sunday Pete talked about how getting unstuck happens as we engage in a process or journey to change. It's not so much about goals as it is about engaging in a system/process/journey of becoming who God has made you to be. At the beginning of this new year, what step might you take in your journey?

<u>LEADER NOTE:</u> If you want better results, then focus on your system/process/journey instead of setting goals. This system/process/journey should be designed to help you become the person you want to become. A system built on the truth of who you are in Christ and your desire to be like Him. Focus on the system (the process, the journey) rather than the results. We'll see more improvement and long lasting change when we implement new processes in our lives rather than simply set big goals for ourselves.
