**Series:** *Jesus Curious*

**Week:** *The Myth of Certainty*

**Key Verse:** Hebrews 11:1

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### Opening Prayer

Heavenly Father,

Thank You for bringing us together today. We come as people who don't have everything figured out, yet we desire to know You more. Teach us what it means to have real faith—not a forced certainty, but a deep and steady trust in You. Help us to be honest about our doubts and courageous in following Jesus anyway. As we talk and listen, shape our hearts so that we trust Your character even when life feels unclear. Grow in us a confident hope that rests in who You are. In Jesus' name, Amen.

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### Discussion Questions & Leader Insights

#### 1. What ideas from the sermon caught your attention?

**Leader Insight:**

Start broad and invitational. This helps everyone engage right away. Listen for themes like “proper confidence,” faith vs. certainty, or trusting Jesus without having every answer.

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#### 2. Read Hebrews 11:1

Faith isn't the absence of doubt, but the presence of trust in the middle of it. How does this definition challenge or encourage the way you think about faith?

**Leader Insight:**

This anchors the conversation in the core idea of the sermon. Help people see that doubt and faith can coexist—faith is about trust, not perfect certainty.

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#### 3. Read John 20:24–29

How does the idea of trusting Jesus like you trust a reliable friend change how you handle the things you don't fully understand?

**Leader Insight:**

Move from definition to relationship. Faith becomes more accessible when framed relationally instead of intellectually.

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**4. Read James 2:19**

What is the difference between believing that Jesus is God and actually trusting Him with your daily decisions as Lord?

**Leader Insight:**

This is the turning point from belief → action. Encourage concrete examples of what trust actually looks like in real life.

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**5. Read Matthew 14:28–29**

What are the "waves" in your current season that tempt you to look away from Jesus, and how does faith act as an anchor during those times?

**Leader Insight:**

Now the discussion becomes personal. Help participants identify real pressures and how focus on Jesus changes their response.

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**6. Read Hebrews 11:8**

What do you find comforting and what do you find challenging about Abraham going out "not knowing where he was going"?

**Leader Insight:**

This builds on uncertainty. Draw out both sides—faith is freeing *and* uncomfortable.

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**7. Read 1 Peter 1:6–7**

Looking back at a difficult season, can you see how your trust in Jesus grew more "pure" because of what you went through?

**Leader Insight:**

Encourage reflection and storytelling. This helps the group see that faith often grows through uncertainty, not around it.

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**8. Read Colossians 3:13**

Why does it require deep faith in Jesus' justice and grace to let go of a grudge against someone who "doesn't deserve" it?

**Leader Insight:**

End with a challenging application. Forgiveness is a tangible expression of trusting God over our own sense of fairness.
